Different kinds of people

Each person is a biologically-constituted social actor with a genderage, class/wealth position, ethnicity, religion, maybe other community-relevant social statuses, a personality, accumulated human resources and liabilities, and a personal history. Men and women, youth and children 'coevolving' with other people, their households and their communities are affected by what happens to each. Individual consequences depend on community trajectory, household trajectory, social networks, genderage, class-wealth, status, political connection, education, health, personal characteristics and chance. The complex of choices different kinds of people make individually and collectively in response to what happens to them also has consequences for them as well as the future trajectory of each community and, taking all communities together, for the country.
